By Car

Penshurst Place is 25 minutes from the M25 junction 5. Then follow the A21 south towards Hastings, leaving at the Hildenborough exit (B245/B2027) or the next exit, South Tonbridge (head towards Tunbridge Wells then right turn to Bidborough B2176) and follow the brown tourist signs to Penshurst Place & Gardens (off B2176).

From the M26 junction 2a, follow the A25 (towards and then through Sevenoaks), then continue on the A225/B245 towards Hildenborough or A21 for Hastings, then as above. Local approaches are well signposted with brown tourist signs.

From other directions, head for the A21/A26 or the A264 towards Tunbridge Wells/Tonbridge and follow the brown signs to Penshurst Place & Gardens via Fordcombe on B2188 or Bidborough on B2176.

Sat nav postcode reference TN11 8DG (though it has been reported to us some systems may not work to this postcode reference). You may wish instead to try searching for Penshurst Place on Google Places or the 'attractions' or 'places of interest' section on your sat nav system, if available.

REFRESHMENTS

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery is recommended.
- It is useful to bring your camera instruction manual if you have one. If you bring SLR lenses, a hot-shoe mounted flash or other accessories, please bring the instruction manual too.
- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted, memory card. We will use card readers to transfer your images to our computers, but in the event that we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your camera to computer data cable too.
- A full set of PDF course notes will be emailed to you after the course so you may like to bring a pen and paper to make a note or two of your own.
- For SLR users, please don't set your camera to shoot RAW images, as they will make downloading too slow.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and rubber band make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
- A tripod (full height) if you have one is essential for landscape, Low-Light & Fill-In Flash and Water & Movement workshops). You do not need a tripod for Explore 1.
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors, plus a garden kneeler or similar for getting low for some photos. If it is very muddy bring boots.
