The Anna Henly Photography Studio is based at her home address, surrounded by fields, on the outskirts of Edinburgh, south of the city centre, on the south side of the bypass A720. There is some off-road parking.

Arriving by car: Parking

There is a driveway and a bit of off-road parking – enough space to accommodate eight cars (with very careful parking) , and more room for parking a couple of minutes' walk away in the Pentland Hills car park at the bottom of the Midlothian Snowsports Centre at Hillend on the A702.

Arriving by car from the north, east or west:

From the A720 Edinburgh bypass take the exit A702 signed for Carlisle and Midlothian Snowsports Centre. Take the A702 south (away from Edinburgh), driving past an Esso petrol station on your left. Immediately after the petrol station, and the Midlothian Snowsports Centre (on the right hand side) the A702 splits into three: the A702, A703 and a lane on the LEFT hand side which is signed to Damhead. Take the left hand lane, and the driveway is IMMEDIATELY on the left. There is a green fence, and two road traffic signs: a tractor and a horse! Please do not follow satnav to EH107EB or you risk sailing past the driveway! There is a house sign on the fence: The Tryst. If you are first to arrive, please park giving consideration to the rest of the group still to arrive.

Arriving by car from the south:

If you are driving from the south on the A701 turn left at the cross roads when you see IKEA on the far side of the cross roads, on the right hand side. Drive all the way to the far end of the lane, and just as you are about to run out of road, turn

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right into the driveway belonging to the last house. There is a green fence, and two road traffic signs: a tractor and a horse! Please do not follow satnav to EH107EB or you probably won't get as far as the driveway! There is a house sign on the fence: The Tryst. If you are first to arrive, please park giving consideration to the rest of the group still to arrive.

If you are driving from the south on the A702 or A703 turn right into the lane, Old Pentland Road – this is a tricky junction and there is no road sign. If you get as far as the Esso petrol station you have missed the turn, do a U-turn at the roundabout and come back taking the left hand lane, turn into the lane on the left, and the driveway IMMEDIATELY on the left. There is a green fence, and two road traffic signs: a tractor and a horse! Please do not follow satnav to EH107EB or you risk sailing past the driveway! There is a house sign on the fence: The Tryst. If you are the first to arrive, please park giving consideration to the rest of the group still to arrive.

Arriving by air at Edinburgh Airport:

Outside the main airport terminal there is a rank for airport taxis. These are not 'black cabs', but private licensed cars available at standard rates. The trip to Anna Henly Photography Studio takes around 20 minutes and costs around £20.

Arriving by rail at Waverley Station or bus from city centre:

Take a taxi, about £15, or walk up onto Princes Street and locate a bus stop on the castle side of Princes Street (south side) for either the no 4 bus – get off at Hillend (the last stop where the bus turns around), cross over the road, and carry on walking south (away from Edinburgh), take the left hand road at the 3-way junction, and turn into the driveway immediately on the left. Or take the no 15 or 15A bus to Penicuik – get off at the stop after the ESSO petrol station: the petrol station after the bus has crossed the bypass. Walk back in the direction the bus has driven (Edinburgh) up to the junction with the A702, and take the lane on your right hand side, and you will immediately reach the driveway to The Tryst.

HOW TO GET THERE

16 St. Mary's Street, Edinburgh EH1 1SU, Scotland

The Edinburgh Training and Conference Venue is based in St Mary's Street - the heart of Edinburgh in the city's beautiful historic Old Town, just off the Royal Mile and minutes from Waverley Station.



Arriving by air at Edinburgh Airport:

Outside the main airport terminal there is a rank for airport taxis. These are not 'black cabs', but private licensed cars available at standard rates. The trip to the training centre takes around 25 minutes and costs around £16. There is also a tram and bus service leaving from outside the airport.

Arriving by rail at Waverley Station:

Leave the station by the steps to Market Street (or by the main pedestrian exit to Waverley Bridge, turning left then left again into Market Street). Cross Market Street along from the City Art Centre and turn left, going under the large decorated bridge. Bear right into Jeffrey Street past Jury's Hotel to the junction (traffic lights) with the High Street. Cross the High Street into St Mary's Street (continuation of Jeffrey Street) and the training centre is down the hill on the left (situated between Slanji and the Russian Shop).

Arriving by car: Parking

There are three multi-storey car parks just a few minutes' walk from Edinburgh Training and Conference Venue. We have a concessionary rate at the St John's Hill NCP car park. To get a 20% discount you just need to get your parking ticket validated by the receptionist at the Edinburgh Training and Conference Venue .

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Arriving by car from the West:

From the M8, approaching the Hermiston Gait junction take the city bypass north to the major 'Gogar' roundabout then follow the signs for the city centre.

From the M9 follow signs for Edinburgh city centre, through the underpass to the Maybury junction. Continue past PC World (right) and the Zoo (left) - remember to stay out of the bus lanes! Shortly after passing Haymarket Station on your right, go straight ahead at the next junctions, soon passing a church (tall steeple) on the left and lots of shops both sides (Habitat on left). Turn right at next junction (Fraser's store on left, Caledonian Hotel on right) into Lothian Road.

Turn left at the third set of lights into Bread Street, then go ahead down West Port through the Grassmarket. Continue straight ahead along Cowgate to the lights at the junction of Pleasance / St Mary's St (Travelodge hotel on the left). Go straight ahead into Holyrood Road and park on the right in the 'NCP' multi-storey car park in St John's Hill. Edinburgh Training and Conference Venue is half way up St Mary's Street on the right.

Arriving by car from the North:

Follow signs for the city centre from A90/Forth Road Bridge via Cramond and Barnton, approaching the city via Blackhall (bear right at the junction at the Kwik-Fit garage). At the roundabout take the 1st exit onto Queensferry Road (A90). Then turn left (one-way) onto Randolph Crescent then immediately turn left onto Great Stuart Street. Turn right onto Ainslie Place and immediately turn right onto St Colme Street. At the traffic signals continue forward (signposted Berwick upon Tweed A1). Continue forward onto York Place. At the Picardy Place roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Leith Street (A900) signposted Galashiels A7, Jedburgh A68. At East End turn right then immediately left onto North Bridge-A7. At the traffic signals turn left onto the High Street. At the next traffic signals turn right onto St Mary's Street. ETCV is a third of the way down on the right.

Arriving by car from the South:

From the A1, or South East, take the City Bypass, and exit the city centre at the Dalkeith junction. (From A68, after Dalkeith go across the bypass, not onto it). Coming in on the Old Dalkeith Road, you will approach a roundabout at the Cameron Toll shopping centre (railway bridge over). Take the third exit (under the bridge), effectively going straight ahead, into St. Leonards. Stay on this road past the Commonwealth Pool and Scottish Widows former HQ (brown building) on your right until on the Pleasance you meet the four-way junction (lights) of Pleasance, St Mary's St (ahead), Cowgate (left) and Holyrood Road (right). Turn right into Holyrood Road and the Scot Park car park is just down the road on the right. The Edinburgh Training and Conference Venue is half way up St Mary's Street on the right.

HOW TO GET THERE

Studio 32, Second Floor, 27 Beaverhall Rd, Edinburgh, EH7 4JE

Studio 32 is based at Beaverhall Arts Studios in the heart of Edinburgh's bohemian district, Broughton. Close to Stockbridge and Leith Walk, and a 15 min stroll from Waverley Station.

Parking

If you are arriving by car, then there is parking within the orange gates at the weekends only. Weekdays you can park on the street at a very reasonable £4-50 per day.

Arriving by rail at Waverley Station

From Waverley Station, head along Princes Street East to Princes Mall, then bear left down Leith St (A900) to the big roundabout. With the Conan Doyle pub behind you, cross over into Broughton St (B901) and continue straight over London Rd into Bellevue heading to Canonmills. Turn right by The Other Place pub into Broughton Rd (B900) and take the 3rd left into Beaverhall Rd. 15-20 mins stroll.

Several buses head from the Town Centre to Canonmills. Click the following link for a guide to getting about in Edinburgh <http://www.edinburgh.org/traveltips/aroundbus/> or cut and paste into your browser.

Drivers can head for Canonmills from any direction via the B900 or B901.

A taxi from the city centre should be around 5.00 GBP and takes a few minutes.

Parking

If you are arriving by car, there is a local public car park just inside the entrance, past the Gatehouse on the left.



Arriving by Car

Lauriston is a short distance from A90 Queensferry Rd at the junction of Quality St, or from the B9085 Ferry Rd onto Mains St. Continue toward Cramond crossing the mini roundabout at the junction of Quality St and Main St and past Tesco on your right. Lauriston Castle entrance is a small driveway on the right, a few yards past Silverknowes Parkway.

No 41 Buses from the Rail Station should take around 20 mins and stop at Davidson's Mains. Nos 42, 43 and 55 also head for Davidson's Mains from the city.

A taxi from Waverly will cost around 10.00 GBP

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS

WORKSHOPS AT THE LOW PORT CENTRE: LINLITHGOW

TIMES

The **classroom** is situated in the **GP Room in the main building, although this may change on occasion according to demand. If in doubt, please call Anna or ask at reception.**

HOW TO GET THERE

TRAIN

From the ticket office at Linlithgow Station, walk down the hill to the High Street, cross over the main road and turn right. The Low Port is the big white building on the left just past the roundabout.

CAR

From Livingston (M8 Junction 3), head for Uphall and turn left onto the B8046; through Ecclesmachan to Threemiletown. Turn left onto the B9080 to Linlithgow. Once in Linlithgow turn right at the traffic lights go under the bridge and then turn right at the roundabout. The centre is on the left immediately after the roundabout.

From Bathgate (M8 Junction 4), take the A801 following signs for Linlithgow, continue on to the A706. As you come into Linlithgow, go straight ahead at the first roundabout, under the railway bridge and then right at the next roundabout. You'll come to another roundabout at the east end of the High Street. Take the left cut off; the Centre is immediately on the left.

From Edinburgh on the M9 come off at junction 3 and turn left. As you enter Linlithgow you should see a Tesco supermarket. The centre is directly opposite. Turn right just after the pedestrian crossing.

From the west on the M9, come off at junction 4 and take the A803 (3rd exit), this road continues on to Linlithgow High Street. Continue straight through the first roundabout you come to on the High Street. At the next roundabout take the left exit. The centre is immediately on your left hand side.

REFRESHMENTS

Tea and Coffee will be available in the classroom but we recommend that you bring a packed lunch. There are local shops just a few minutes' walk from the centre.

Rebus Walk EH1

Shoot from the hip in gritty B+W on this stroll around Edinburgh, and evoke the darker underbelly of the city so wonderfully portrayed in the Ian Rankin crime novels. This Photo Walk concentrates on the mood and atmosphere conveyed by the images which adorn the front covers of the Rebus Books, by the photographers Tricia Malley and Ross Gillespie. A chance to discover your Picture Style Menu and Exposure Compensation dial to create dark, textured images seething with narrative. This walk always finishes with a trip to the Oxford Bar to view the original B+W prints from the book series, and a wee dram!!

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- Your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery (recommended).
- The fully-detailed camera instruction manual (it's worth checking your manual – sometimes the printed one you receive only contains basic facts, and there's a fully-detailed manual on the CD that came with the camera, in which case bring the CD too).
- Camera lenses, a hot-shoe mounted flash and any other accessories, plus instruction manual.
- Memory card(s) - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, formatted, memory card. We may use a card reader to transfer your images to our computer, but in the event that we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your 'camera to computer' data cable too.
- For DSLR users, please don't set your camera to shoot RAW images, as they will make downloading too slow.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera. An umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
- Bring a tripod (full height) if you have one (**essential** for Landscape, Low-Light & Fill-In Flash and Water & Movement workshops).
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors, plus a garden kneeler or similar for getting low for some photos.
- In addition, it can be quite muddy while out taking photographs, so for the sake of the venue's staff, please bring a pair of trainers or indoor boots or shoes.
- Reading glasses if required;
- Money if the workshop has a coffee shop involved; and
- Snacks – if you need food to fuel your creativity.
