WORKSHOPS AT SOUTH LAKES SAFARI ZOO

TIMES

All workshops run from 10:30am to 4:30pm. The Zoo opens at 10:00am and it is about 10 minutes walk to the classroom (longer if you stop to look at animals en-route). Please report to the classroom before 10:30am.

HOW TO GET THERE

Using Sat Nav

The post code is LA12 0LU.

From M6 Junction 36

Leave the M6 at Junction 36 and take the A590 towards Barrow-in-Furness. Stay on this road for about 26 miles and just after Lindal-in-Furness, you will see the brown signs to turn right for South Lakes Safari Zoo.

From the West Coast

Follow the A595 South until it's Junction with the A590. Take the A590 East for about one mile and then you will see the brown signs to turn left for South Lakes Safari Zoo.

From the Car Park

You will need to show your booking confirmation email at the ticket office to get access to the Zoo. Then please follow the main path into the zoo to the train station, then follow the path that runs alongside the tracks to the end of the line and then stay on that path until you see the Classroom (just past the toilets). There will be a Going Digital sign outside.

REFRESHMENTS

Coffee and Tea will be available on arrival and replenished throughout the day. There is a cafe adjacent to the Classroom, serving hot and cold food, but be aware it may be very busy, especially in holiday times. You are welcome to bring a packed lunch if you prefer.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery is advisable if you have one.
- A zoom or telephoto lens reaching 200mm is recommended to get the most from this workshop though is not essential.
- Please bring your camera manual if you have a print copy.
- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted, memory card. We will use card readers to transfer your images to our computers, but in the event that we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your camera to computer data cable too.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
- A tripod is not needed for this workshop, although a monopod may be useful if you have one and are intending to use a large telephoto lens.
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors.
- Notes will be emailed out following the workshop, but please bring a pen to make notes on the activity sheets provided during the day.
