Workshops at Tatton Park - Stable Courtyard

TIMES All workshops run from 10am to 4pm (except Photo Walks which may vary at certain times of the year – please check details on the website). Please report to the classroom for registration at 9.45am.

HOW TO GET THERE

By road: Tatton is around 2 miles north of Knutsford; 4 miles south of Altrincham; 5 miles from M6 Junction 19; 3 miles from M56, Junction 7. It is well signposted from A556; use the Rostherne entrance on Ashley Road, 1.5 miles north-east of the junction of A5034 with A50. You should enter by the exit gate on the right-hand side, which will be open before the main gate is opened to the general public.

By bus: Buses from Knutsford on high season Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays Easter to end August; otherwise from surrounding areas to Knutsford, then 2 miles.

By train: The nearest railway station is Knutsford, 2 miles.

From the car park follow the path through to the main entrance courtyard. The workshops take place in either the Rostherne or the Knutsford Room which are on your left as you enter the main courtyard. Look out for the Going Digital 'eye' logo.

REFRESHMENTS & FACILITIES

There are loos in the courtyard.

Tea and coffee will be available at intervals during the sessions in the classroom; hot meals, snacks and cakes are available from the NT cafe in the stable courtyard, or you welcome to bring a packed lunch.

WHAT TO BRING ON 1-DAY PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery is recommended.

You will need your fully-detailed camera instruction manual. Please check carefully as sometimes the printed one you receive only contains basic facts and there is a fully detailed manual on the CD that came with the camera, in which case bring the CD, print the manual out or load a pdf version onto your smartphone or other device. If you do not have a manual, you may be able to download it from the Internet. If you bring SLR lenses, a hot-shoe mounted flash or other accessories, please bring their instruction manuals too.

- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted memory card. We will use card readers to transfer your images to our computers, but just in case we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your camera to computer data cable too.
- Please set your camera to shoot in jpeg (or jpeg and RAW) as RAW images can make downloading rather slow.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape/elastic bands make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera. Proprietary raincovers are also available from reputable retailers and need not be expensive.
- A tripod or similar support is optional on most workshops - you don't need to buy one specially. If you would like to try using a tripod, please contact Graham, as we may have one you can borrow for the day.
- A sturdy tripod is, however, strongly recommended for our *Landscape, Water, Low Light* and some other more advanced workshops (please check course information on the website).
- Dress in suitable clothing for outdoor sessions – several thinner layers are more versatile than a single, thicker layer. A waterproof/ windproof jacket will be useful. Comfortable, sturdy footwear or walking boots are advised, especially for Photowalks, and waterproof trousers might also prove useful.
- In addition, it can be quite muddy while out taking photographs, so for the sake of the venue's staff, please bring a pair of trainers or indoor boots or shoes.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS

Tatton Park - Home Farm (Low Light and Fill-In Flash Workshops)

For **Low Light workshops at Home Farm** approach as overleaf and drive towards the main car park, but just before the car park entrance, turn right along the driveway to Home Farm. There is a disabled car park on the right hand side where you can park for the day. Head for the Visitor Entrance (1) and follow the map below across the courtyard to the Schoolroom (6)



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
