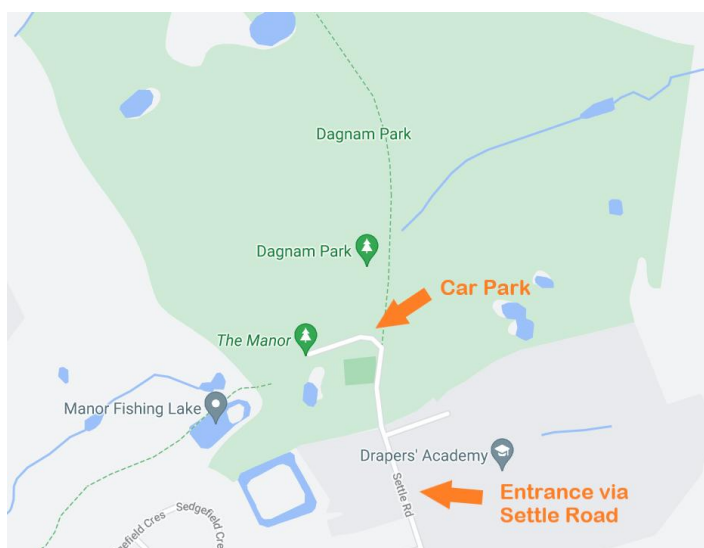
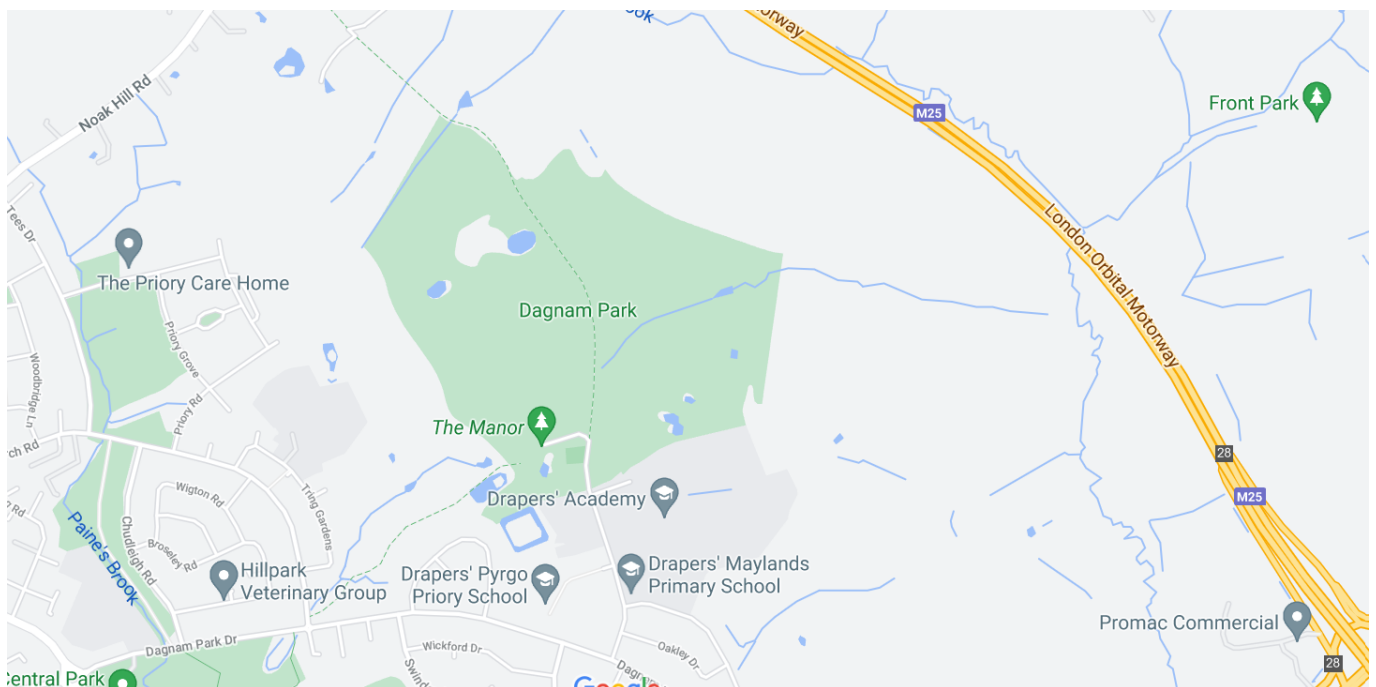
PHOTO WALKS IN DAGNAM PARK

HOW TO GET THERE

Dagnam Park, Settle Road, Harold Hill, RM3 9XR

By Car - please note if using a sat nav, Google Maps or similar, that the post code will get you to Settle Road but you may have to continue driving to reach the car park. Parking is free of charge. See map above.

By Public Transport – you can arrive at either Romford or Harold Wood train stations and pick up local bus services to Settle Road followed by a short walk. Please plan your journey in advance and check for railway engineering works and local road closures that may result in bus route diversions.

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- You will need your camera. **Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery** if you have one
- You will need a zoom lens – 200mm plus lens or 10X compact zoom above for the walks (300mm for full frame cameras)
- Please bring your camera manual if you have a print copy. If you bring DSLR lenses or other accessories, please bring the instruction manual too
- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted memory card. Bring a few spare memory cards if possible. **You are likely to take more photos than you think!**
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors. Please bring knee pads or dustbin liners to provide good protection for kneeling.
- **Do not to wear shorts and/or sandals in case of brambles, nettles and tics**
- It is advisable not to wear brightly colored clothes as these can frighten the deer
