
PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS

PHOTO WALKS ON HOLY ISLAND.

TIMES

This workshop will run from 10am to 4pm. Please arrive at 10am at our meeting point which will be near the pedestrian exit from the main car park to the village on the Island. Exact timings may slightly vary due to tide times but will be confirmed closer to the day.

HOW TO GET THERE

From the A1 follow the signs for Beal and Lindisfarne Causeway, then follow the road over the causeway to the **MAIN CAR PARK** on Holy Island, which is located on the left hand side of the road, immediately following the very sharp zig-zag bend and just before the 30mph limit signs. The car park is 'pay-and-display'. Drivers are cautioned that small vertical posts are used to mark out the parking bays. There are no public toilets in this car park. Parking is charged between 08:00-18:00.

Parking: £7 for all day parking. *Please note there is no parking within the village itself. Toilet facilities can be found at the coach park enroute to the castle.*

Causeway Safe Crossing times

The coastguard recommends that you should leave 30mins either side of the safe crossing times due to variable tides and always check the times before crossing. If you are late please adhere to this advice and do not risk crossing outside of the recommended safe crossing time zone.

Please be aware that Holy Island can be very busy at certain times of the year, so many of the café's may be full at peak times.

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS & PHOTO WALKS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery is recommended.
 - Bring your camera manual if it is small and light. If you bring SLR lenses and other accessories, please bring their instruction manuals too.
 - Memory card(s) - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted, memory card.
 - A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and some sticky tape make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
 - Bring a tripod (full height) if you have one (essential for landscape, Low-Light & Fill-In Flash and Water & Movement workshops).
 - Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors, plus a garden kneeler or similar for getting low for some photos. A hat and sunscreen can be useful during the summer months.
 - In addition, it can be quite muddy while out taking photographs, so please bring a pair of trainers or indoor boots or shoes to change into after the course.
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
