WORKSHOPS AT PAINSHILL PARK.

TIMES

All workshops run from 10.15am to 4.15pm. Please meet your tutor at the classroom from 10.00am (early entry to Painshill Park from 10am has been arranged but please do not arrive any earlier as the venue will be closed).

HOW TO GET THERE - Portsmouth Rd, Cobham, Surrey, KT11 1JE.

On arrival at the venue please follow the drive to the end where there is ample parking on the left. From the car park follow the signposts to reception, cross the bridge, and continue towards the building. Go up the steps and Reception is the first door on the right and the next door on the right is our classroom – the Abercorn Room. A Going Digital notice will be on the door.

By Car:

Painshill can be reached via the M25 / J10 / A3 towards London. Exit at Junction with A245 towards Cobham. Entrance to free car park is off Between Streets, Cobham, (A245) 200m east of the A245/A307 roundabout. **Closest sat nav reference KT11 1AA**

By Rail:

Take the train from Waterloo or Vauxhall to Cobham & Stoke d'Abernon or Weybridge (SouthWest Trains). Note: Taxis are available from Cobham or Weybridge Railway Stations. Alternatively, take the train from Waterloo to Surbiton or Kingston then by direct link The Surrey Parks and Gardens Explorer Bus Route 515 / 515A.

By Bus:

Route 408 (Epsom Buses): Sutton / Leatherhead / Cobham (No Saturday or Sunday service).

Route 515 / 515A (Travel London) The Surrey Park and Gardens Explorer Bus Kingston / Surbiton / Esher / Cobham / Wisley / Guildford.

PHOTOGRAPHY PERMIT

WHAT TO BRING ON PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS:

- You will need your camera. Ensure it has fresh/fully charged batteries and a spare battery is recommended.
- It is useful to bring your camera instruction manual if you have one. If you bring SLR lenses, a hot-shoe mounted flash or other accessories, please bring the instruction manual too.
- Memory card - it is essential that you start the day with an empty, preferably newly formatted, memory card. We will use card readers to transfer your images to our computers, but in the event that we are not able to do this successfully, please bring your camera to computer data cable too.
- A full set of PDF course notes will be emailed to you after the course so you may like to bring a pen and paper to make a note or two of your own.
- For SLR users, please don't set your camera to shoot RAW images, as they will make downloading too slow.
- A camera bag is useful for protecting your camera and equipment when outdoors, and a transparent plastic bag and rubber band make a good, temporary waterproof cover for your camera and an umbrella will protect your equipment and you in wet weather.
- A tripod (full height) if you have one is essential for landscape, Low-Light & Fill-In Flash and Water & Movement workshops). You do not need a tripod for Explore 1.
- Dress in warm, comfortable clothing for outdoor sessions. A waterproof/ windproof top will be useful. Comfortable but strong footwear is advised for photographing outdoors, plus a garden kneeler or similar for getting low for some photos. If it is very muddy bring boots.
